

# Citizenship Award

## General

The **Citizenship Award** is given to a professional engineer/geoscientist who, in the opinion of the Association has made a significant contribution to improving the quality of life in his/her community. The Award recognizes outstanding service and dedication to the Province of New Brunswick through voluntary participation in community organizations, government-sponsored activities, or humanitarian work.

## Nomination

Nominations for the Citizenship Award must be submitted to the Awards Committee in writing on the appropriate APEGNB form and must be supported by at least two (2) members.

## Eligibility Criteria

The nominee must be a professional engineer or geoscientist registered in good standing with APEGNB.\*

*\*Members of the APEGNB Council are not considered eligible for an award until a period of at least six months has elapsed from the completion date of their term of office.*

## Selection

The Awards Committee will consider each nominee on his/her merits and make recommendations to Council on the conferring of the Award. Consideration is given to continued leadership in the profession and in the community, to outstanding achievements, and to recognition obtained. Recipients will be notified by telephone and in writing.

## Presentation

The Citizenship Award will be presented at an appropriate Branch function or Annual Meeting in a manner in keeping with the dignity of the occasion.

## Award

Trophy engraved with recipient's name.

## Promotion

Award recipients agree to standard publicity notification arranged by APEGNB which may include:

- Pictures of award recipient and biography printed in Annual magazine
- Pictures of award recipient to appear in newsletter--Engenuity
- Coverage of award recipient in New Brunswick newspapers

## Commencement

The first **Citizenship Award** was presented in 1987. The award does not have to be conferred on an annual basis.
