

C.C. Kirby Award

General

The **C.C. Kirby Award** is given in recognition of outstanding service or contribution to both the engineering profession and the province of New Brunswick. Named in honour of Charles C. Kirby, a distinguished engineer who was the founder of the Association and co-founder and first President of the Canadian Council of Professional Engineers, the C.C. Kirby Award is the most prestigious award a professional engineer can receive from the Association.

Nomination

Nominations for the C.C. Kirby Award must be submitted to the Awards Committee in writing on the appropriate APEGNB form and must be supported by at least six (6) members.

Eligibility Criteria

The nominee must be a professional engineer registered in good standing with APEGNB.*

**Members of the APEGNB Council are not considered eligible for the award until a period of at least six months has elapsed from the completion date of their term of office.*

Selection

Council shall appoint a committee, to be known as the C.C. Kirby Award Committee, comprised of the President and three (3) Past Presidents of the Association. It shall be the duty of this committee to consider each nominee on his/her merits and to recommend to Council the conferring of the Award. Recipient will be notified by telephone and in writing.

Presentation

The Award will be presented at an appropriate function during the Annual Meeting. The presentation will be delivered in a manner in keeping with the dignity of the occasion.

Award

Trophy engraved with recipient's name.

Promotion

Award recipients agree to standard publicity notification arranged by APEGNB which may include:

- Pictures of award recipient and biography printed in Annual magazine
- Pictures of award recipient to appear in newsletter--Engenuity
- Coverage of award recipient in New Brunswick newspapers

Commencement

The first **C.C. Kirby Award** was presented in 1974. The award does not have to be conferred on an annual basis.
