ROLE OF ENGINEERS AND GEOSCIENTISTS NEW BRUNSWICK

The Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of New Brunswick's (APEGNB's) mandate is to serve and protect the public interest by:

- ensuring that only qualified professionals with the necessary education and experience are licensed to practice engineering and geoscience in New Brunswick
- governing and regulating the professions under the authority of the Province's *Engineering and Geoscience Professions Act (1999)*
- establishing and maintaining standards of knowledge and skill among its members
- establishing and maintaining standards of professional ethics and code of conduct among its members

APEGNB has a statutory obligation to investigate and discipline members and ensure compliance of those who present themselves to be Professional Engineers or Professional Geoscientists.

APEGNB MEMBERS' PROFESSIONAL OBLIGATION

APEGNB members are obligated to conduct themselves with integrity, honesty, fairness and objectivity and to hold paramount the health, safety and welfare of the general public, the environment, their clients, and their employers.

- APEGNB members must be aware of, and comply with, all legislation and regulations pertaining to their field of professional practice.
- APEGNB members must ensure that all associated activities adhere to accepted industry and environmental practices and comply with the legislative and regulatory framework.
- APEGNB members develop and maintain a competent level of expertise in their field of professional practice.
- APEGNB members ensure that environmental planning and risk management as appropriate is included in all activities related to their field of professional practice.
